Provisional Results 2017

Our 'official' results will be published in the Autumn, but I wanted to share the headline figures for this year with you now.

Year R: 81% at a 'Good Level of Development'

Year 2: 83% at 'Expected Standard' in Reading; 80% in Writing; 77% in Maths and 73% in all three combined

Year 6: 68% at 'Expected Standard' in Reading; 79% in Writing; 79% in Maths and 68% in all three combined

Based on what we know so far, our results will be in-line with or above the local and national averages. There are, of course, some things we need to improve, but overall these are a very solid set of results and a testament to the hard work of the children and staff!

Year 6 Production

The cultural highlight of the summer term at Wildmoor Heath is the Year 6 production. Keeping with tradition,



the children put on their version a Shakespeare play. This year it was the magical A Midsummer Night's Dream. And what a treat it was! Clearly inspired by what they
