



# Uniform & Appearance Policy

## **Article 28**

Every child has the right to an education.

**Children should look smart when wearing their school uniform.**

The official school colours are maroon and pale (sky) blue. Our uniform expectations are detailed below. **All clothing must be clearly marked with your child's name.**

## **Uniform**

### **Uniform for boys:**

- Pale (sky) blue shirt with tie OR
- Pale (sky) blue polo shirt without tie
- Grey trousers or shorts
- Maroon jumper, sweatshirt or fleece
- Grey socks
- Black shoes
- Training shoes for use on the school field at playtime / PE

### **Uniform for girls:**

- Pale (sky) blue shirt with tie OR
- Pale (sky) blue polo shirt / blouse without tie
- Grey trousers, shorts, skirt or pinafore
- Maroon jumper, sweatshirt, fleece or cardigan
- Grey socks or tights
- *Girls may also wear a blue & white checked summer dress with white socks.*
- Black shoes
- Training shoes for use on the school field at playtime / PE

- **All children should wear a suitable coat during wet or cold weather.**
- **Reception class children are encouraged to bring in a pair of wellington boots.**

## PE / Sports Kit

### PE / Sports Kit (boys & girls):

- Navy shorts
- Pale (sky) blue T-shirt
- Trainers (for outdoor PE)
- For outdoor PE, children may wear plain navy blue jogging bottoms and a plain navy or maroon warm top (different from their school sweatshirt / fleece).

## Appearance and Jewellery

Long shoulder length hair should be tied back and off the face. **There should be no extremes of hair style** (e.g. marks are cut into the hair / use of different colours). **Accessories worn in the hair should also be suitable for school and kept to a minimum. No make-up or nail polish should be worn.** Children are not allowed to wear jewellery at school with the exception of Medic-Alert bracelets and earrings. **If your child has pierced ears, plain silver or gold studs must be worn.** Earrings must be removed for PE lessons. Watches may be worn but should be clearly marked with your child's name. If you wish your child to wear other jewellery for religious reasons, please speak to the Headteacher. No other body jewellery should be worn.
